How to Easily Sign Up to Accept SNAP-EBT Payment

Retail food stores and farmers' markets across New Mexico can **boost revenue by accepting SNAP-EBT** (food stamps) payments.





Accepting SNAP benefits the local economy, especially in rural areas, which increases access to fresh, unprepared foods across New Mexico.

A business can accept SNAP-EBT when sales are made in person once Food Nutrition Services (FNS) has approved its application by issuing a permit to the business. Businesses must then program or buy equipment to process the sales. *See 5 Easy Steps below for this process.

FIVE EASY STEPS TO ACCEPT SNAP:

Register for an online USDA Account:

- Select "Customer" for the type of user and provide your email when prompted.
- Activate your account.

Complete the online SNAP application: https://www.fns.usda.gov/snap/retail er/application-status

• You have **30 days** after starting the application to complete and submit it or it will be deleted. FNS has 45 days from the date they receive your completed application to make a determination.

Submit supporting documentation.

 Instructions for submitting your documentation will be at the end of the application.
